

# February Championships Rules 2017

1. Shotguns must be unloaded and kept in a sleeve whilst travelling between stands and around the shooting ground.
2. When out of the sleeve the shotgun must be broken and empty and only loaded when on the firing point.
3. No gun is to be pointed at anyone.
4. The gun may be mounted or off the shoulder when calling for a target.
5. While on the firing point the barrels must be kept pointed in a safe direction, especially in the event of a misfire.
6. Semi-automatics may be used but must show a breach flag when not on a firing point.
7. The wearing of visible hearing protection in both ears is compulsory.
8. Although not a CPSA registered shoot, The Oxford Gun Company require that the CPSA regulations on eye protection are followed. (i.e. the wearing of adequate and effective visible eye protection by shooters, officials, masters and spectators at or around the shooting grounds)
9. Head protection in the form of a peaked hat is strongly recommended.
10. Competitors are required to have a minimum of £3 million Third Party Liability insurance cover.
11. Alcohol is strictly forbidden to all competitors. Spectators are also requested to observe this rule.
12. A referee's decision is final. An objection to a decision must be raised immediately.
13. No advice or coaching may be given to competitors on the stands.
14. Individuals are responsible for the safe storage of their shotguns and belongings when not in use.  
Neither the organiser nor ground owners will accept responsibility for the loss, damage or injury to persons, their property or effects whilst on the shooting ground.
15. Points are awarded- one for a kill, none for a miss.
16. In the event of a team or individual tie, a shoot-off will be between the high guns of each team.
17. In the event of any ties there will be shoot-offs for all prizes in each category..
18. All prizes must be collected within 1 month from 28th February 2017.
19. No game cartridges are to be used. Maximum 28g 7 1/2 to be used
20. A novice is defined as anyone who has been shooting less than 2 years and has not won the equivalent of £20 or more in any competition.
21. A Junior must be aged under 18 years.

## **CCI Club Competition:**

23. No Shooter that has shot for their country, or in CPSA classes AAA, AA, or A in all disciplines may qualify for the CCI Challenge.
24. Team Shooters for the CCI Challenge can be non-CPSA Members and B & C CPSA Classes.
25. An adult must accompany School and junior teams at all times.
26. Must be a valid member of your Gun Club or Shooting School.
27. School, College or University teams can enter.
28. Scores only count for the CCI Challenge and cannot be transferred to Sabatti Challenge.
29. Clays must be collected from The Oxford Gun Company.
